In this 3 Session Workshop, Mr. Kline will lead participants in all aspects of song performance, from analyzing music and lyrics to specific audition techniques for college admissions as well as for stage productions. Mr. Kline will conduct individual coaching with each participant, discussing how to bring truth and emotion to your song.

Students will bring 2 32-Bar selections and choose and perform one to work on. Mr Kline may or may not ask for the second song. He will suggest phyiscal and acting exercises, partner work, emotional re-creation and analysis work on your song. Students will only sing in one Session but are invited to observe the other 2 Sessions.

**Ages:** High school students - preference given to students graduating in 2015 and 2016.

## **Gary Kline**

Gary began teaching Voice for the School of Drama in 1989. During his tenure, he created and taught such Classes as Singing for Actors, Musical Theater Ensemble, as well as Cabaret and Acting a Song which he continues teaching. He was appointed as Assistant Head of Musical Theater, and during that tenure created the CMU/CLO New Works Partnership, resulting in Workshops of new Musicals such as CASPAR, ONE RED FLOWER, and YEAST NATION (created by URINETOWN Writers), among several others. Under the partnership, Gary coordinated the JERRY HERMAN LEGACY CONCERT, with Mr. Herman appearing on the Chosky Stage along with Broadway vets Karen Morrow, Jason Graae and Donald Pippin. In 2006, Gary negotiated a new National Partnership with CLO, ASCAP and Stephen Schwartz' New Writer's Workshops, which have produced Staged Readings of ALIVE AT TEN and BUBBLE BOY at CMU's School of Drama.
